You may have seen a new face out and about on the estate in recent weeks.

Paul Harris joined us as LCA's new Maintenance Operative at the end of March and has since been working hard to get to know all our homes and tenants.

Paul, from Brierley Hill, previously worked as a selfemployed carpenter before joining our team.

#### **Rent rise on the cards**

You may not have realised that, for the last four years, Lyng tenants have benefited from a 1% rent cut each year. The government made a policy decision that, from April 2016, all housing association rents should be reduced by 1% every year for four years – so your rent was reduced in April 2016, April 2017 and April 2018, with the final reduction in April 2019.

#### What happens next year?

The government has decided that housing associations can increase their rents from next April. The rise will be in line with the Consumer Price Index (CPI), plus 1%.

So, along with other housing association tenants across the country, LCA tenants will see an increase in their rent from April 2020.

#### What about service charges?

Service charges cover the cost of additional services such as communal lighting, landscaping and cleaning.

These costs rose as contractors and energy suppliers increased their prices, so service charges were not reduced or restricted over the last four years.

## How do Lyng rents compare?

Lyng rents are around 40% less than the equivalent private sector rents.
